Other favorite NY stage appearances include Elizabeth Meriweather's Nicky Goes Goth (NY Fringe Festival), Rite of Return (Theater for the New City), Jeannette in Neil Simon's Last of the Red Hot Lovers, Sidney Morris' AIDS monodrama, The Boy's Mother and the Spotlight On Festival's production of Andrew Rothkin's tryin t'touch the sun, directed by Glory Sims Bowen. From this year-long festival of 72 plays, Anita received a Best Supporting Actress

nomination and shared the cast's Best Ensemble award. She has played the role of Mae Peterson in *Bye Bye Birdie* twice - at Yorktown Stage and in the North American tour starring Troy Donahue. She has NOT appeared on *Law & Order*. This performance - and all future performances - is dedicated to the memory of my dear friend, Fay Miller.

Why Two Spoons?

The question that we are most often asked as it relates to the Two Spoons Theatre Company is "Why 'Two Spoons'?" To give credit where credit is due, the answer comes from the best of all possible worlds - music. The incredibly talented and creative singer/songwriter, Amy Fix (who will perform here tonight prior to the show) wrote a simple and touching song a few years back called "You Are My Spoon." In her wonderful lyrics, Amy writes: "You are my spoon. In a world of forks and knives, you are a spoon." In a world chock-full of sharp, hurtful and often dangerous forks and knives, we (Two Spoons' Co-Founders Brandon Kalbaugh and Cinda Lawrence) decided that we would expand Amy's beautiful metaphor in an attempt to break the all-too-common mold. On a planet hip-deep in cruelty, politics and hypocrisy we decided that we would do our level-best to remain spoons - in our art, our work and our lives. We formed the Two Spoons Theatre Company in 2004 in the sincere hope that the metaphor would grow and most importantly that the Two Spoons Theatre Company might serve as an innovative and healthy sanctuary where artists can work and grow, secure in the knowledge that they may always take big risks without fear of emotional scars or fear itself. Our eternal gratitude to Amy Fix for inspiring us with her music - may each of us be successful in our continual search for spoons among the forks and knives of this world...here's to the spoons out there...may you live long, prosper and multiply.
